

Are your FIRE(d) up for retirement - What does it take to retire early?



40th Anniversary of the Release of the Film.

Filming began on April 1st 1978 and was completed on October 1st 1978. The crew arrived in Stalybridge on April 16th the famous opening shot of the movie is of the war memorial, the camera then pans out onto Trinity Street showing a convoy of American trucks and Jeeps led by a Harley motorcycle.

"Howdy!" Shouts a GI, A local in his flat cap says to his mate "Stupid lot of buggers aren't they, I bet they've just got off the boat, it makes you think doesn't it?"

"What?" asks his mate.

"What women see in em!" he replies,

YANKS film opening credits then commence. Other Scenes are of Market Street as the Troops march through the town, as they are about to depart, with a local woman screaming at a GI with a baby by him. Another scene at the beginning is of a truck with soldiers, which include Matt Dyson the US army cook played by (Richard Gere) again on Market Street, and another on the corner of Melbourne Street. The Bus Station was used in the film, and who can forget Wendy Morgan (Mollie) as the bus conductress, with Stalybridge embodied on her hat. Another shot again at the beginning is on Stamford Street above Marshall Twigge, the undertakers, where we see an unshaven face at the window, St Paul's church, for the concert in which Helen (Vanessa Redgrave) and John (William Devane) appear, and of course, Stamford Golf Course which was used as the Camp.

Although classed as Stalybridge, many locations were used in the filming including, Stockport, Keighley Station and goods yard, Steeton, Silsden, Moore, Warrington (Ship Canal) Grand Hotel, Llandudno, Twickenham Studios, Southowram, Halifax and Scotney Castle which formed the setting for Vanessa Redgrave's character. Hyde Town Hall was also used for New Years Eve dance scene and fight.

In Saddleworth, Dobcross Square featured in many scenes as this was the home of Jean Morewood (Lisa Eichhorn) her father Jim (Tony Melody) and mother Clarrie (Rachel Roberts) and brother Geoff (Martin Smith) One interesting shot is at the beginning of the Film where we see the convoy of trucks and Jeeps ascend the road towards Denshaw. It was here Richard Gere uttered his first words in the movie. Blackstone Edge has the famous panoramic shot of Lisa and Richard on the rocks there. Other shots were the cycle scene nearby and of course at Pule Hill, Marsden Moor as the troops prepare for a training exercise on the surrounding moorland.

Colin Welland wrote the story, and the Script in conjunction with Walter Bernstein, with the final draft submitted on the 18th March. Further changes were required. Directed by Oscar winner John Schlesinger who was familiar with the area, notably with Stockport and Ashton under Lyne, having directed 'A Kind of Loving' and 'Billy Liar' respectively starring Tom Courtenay and Julie Christie. Ashton Palais was used for the dance scenes in the latter.

However, it was his success with the movie 'Marathon Man' that eventually helped him to raise the money for the 'Yanks Project', which was predominantly with German & US Finance. His friend Richard Rodney Bennett arranged the music score for the film. Director Ken Russell's wife, Shirley was the costume designer, which won her an Academy Award.

The choice of characters was interesting, the studios executives wanted Al Pacino or Dustin Hoffman, however John Schlesinger wanted Richard Gere for Matt, having seen him in Looking for Mr Goodbar, with Diane Keaton. "There was a complexity in him that hadn't been tapped in his previous films, a sensitivity and beauty," John added.

Richard Gere kept to, himself, while on locations; often going for long rides on his motorbike in the Yorkshire Countryside while filming there in between takes, as he was immersed in his part.

The producer Joseph Janni wanted Jane Seymour or Cheri Lunghi, to play the part of Jean Moreton but thankfully, Schlesinger picked American actress Lisa Eichhorn so convincing was her northern accent at the audition where Michael Childers and Colin Welland were also present. John was smitten with her eyes, that he would view her performance in the film as nearly pitch perfect. In fact, in a memo sent by Janni to Schlesinger on 1st June 1978, he said, "Lisa gets better and better". So much so, that she was nominated for a Golden Globe Award for Best Actress and a new star was born.

United Artists chose to present a special local preview at the Davenport Cinema, Stockport on 18th October 1979 prior to the Leicester Square Odeon Premier in London on 1st November, with HRH Princess Anne in attendance. However the American Premier had taken place in New York City on 19th September 1979. Lisa attended the event in the company of Richard Gere. The film was playing nationwide throughout the U.K. Cinemas in December 1979 and January 1980, often retained in the cinemas for weeks at a time; especially in the regions, where it was filmed, Hyde, Stalybridge, etc.

It was superb that Yanks film stars Lisa Eichhorn and Wendy Morgan visited Stalybridge as guests of ours to meet their many fans of the movie, in June 2014, which just coincidentally tied in with the anniversary of the D DAY landings, and also in August 2014 when Lisa found time in her busy schedule to accompany us as our guest to the Yanks Weekend at Dobcross, where she visited the Swan Inn, a favourite of hers, and was made to feel very welcome. It was here that I presented Lisa with a replica of an Oscar for Best Actress for Yanks, long overdue, which brought that famous smile.

The usual military display and convoy will once again take place on the Sunday, which is always popular with the crowds, which will include a military vehicle convoy through Uppermill High Street on Sunday.

Celebrations are dedicated to the filming of the movie "YANKS" which starred Richard Gere and Vanessa Redgrave. Scenes from the 1979 film are created in some of the Saddleworth villages, including Dobcross, Uppermill and also Stalybridge. A lot of the 'extras' used in the classic were chosen from these and surrounding villages. A scene from the film which involves two soldiers getting soaked is replayed outside the Swan Inn in Dobcross every year.

The Yanks weekend is a celebration of this great film and everyone certainly enjoys recreating this wartime atmosphere.

The Old Co-Operative

On the 40th anniversary of the film itself, we thought it was only right to bring you an exclusive interview with one of the films leading stars, the one and only Lisa Eichhorn. Our very own feature writer and friend of Lisa, Mark Sheppard managed to grab a chat with the film star from her home in the US.

Forty years since the release of the movie 'Yanks', in which you starred with Richard Gere, what particular memories do you recall?

I remember the sense of responsibility I felt toward John Schlesinger for giving me the opportunity and to myself for wanting to create a character that was truthful. And, I remember the kindness of the people and the places where we filmed. They are etched into my memory like old friends.

In 2014, you visited Stalybridge with co-star Wendy Morgan to an exhibition of Yank's memorabilia, presented by myself and Joyce Raven, and then in August to Saddleworth for the Yanks weekend, with us once again, it must have brought back many fine memories?

I've had the privilege of working in the North of England more than half a dozen times in my career. I've worked at the Royal Exchange Theatre several times, in and around Manchester on "Cracker", as well as last autumn in Yorkshire

on the yet to be released "Deus." I have always loved working in the North and every time I come I have fond memories. Obviously, YANKS is very, very special because it was my first film and my first time in the North.

When I read the original script, I noted there had been some alterations in the actual film, Did you improvise some scenes during the making of the movie, or did it involve ongoing re-writes?

I didn't improvise a single word or scene. I wouldn't have presumed to do that so early in my career. It was only years later working on new plays or low budget films that because of my experience I might have been invited to collaborate in that way.

I believe you first met Director John Schlesinger for the role of the Shop girl Jean Moreton in December 1977, How did that come about?

My agent was eager for me to start doing film work. I'd already met Jack Clayton and been cast for a project that got cancelled, so, YANKS was the next. It was also a big deal because of the subject matter and John's intentions to discover a new Julie Christie.

You were nominated for a Golden Globe award for best actress, and also for best new star, for your role in Yanks. This must have been one of the major highlights of your career? But I also note you were nominated for a BAFTA, in your next film the Merchant-Ivory production 'The Europeans' which you filmed in Boston I believe. A very proud moment for you?

Honestly, I was naive about the benefit of winning awards at that time. I'd studied at RADA and been in England long enough to know that you just "carried on." These days social media has changed everything. I dare say I would have had or been taught to have a different response to promoting my career now with the early opportunities I received then. I was proud of my achievements but unprepared for campaigning. Some lessons in life are learned later.

You were the Producer, co-writer, of the film 'Defenders of Riga' Latvia's official

entry to the 2009 Academy Awards, Did you attend this, and who did you meet?

No, I didn't go and in the end, the film failed to make the final cut of entries. The Latvian producer declined my help in Hollywood until it was too late to help promote the picture in any timely fashion. I don't mean to be unkind, but the entire saga of the making of that film and the producer coming back to me after I had offered my help the year before would make an article on its own.

Lisa, You have starred in movies such as 'Cutters Way' with Jeff Bridges, which you won the Best Actress Award (American Division) Deauville film festival. A proud moment no doubt? In fact, it was deemed as the most underrated performance of the decade by the American Film Institute?

Yes, I'm proud of my work in CUTTER'S WAY and at that time for whatever reason, I read about the Best Actress win long after it had happened. At that time festivals were not the career-shaping, buzz-creating, fashion hyping vehicles that they have become.

You have appeared in many films such as 'The Wall' also 'The Vanishing', Moon 44,' The Talented Mr Ripley', however one of my favourite movies you starred in was 'A Modern Affair' distributed by TriStar. Why has it only been seen by so few? In fact, it won The Long Island Festival Audience Award.

A MODERN AFFAIR is one of my favourite characters. The film was done for very little money by Vern Oakley and as with other films having completed the project, there was not an equal amount of money to market it.

You are described as an Actress, Writer, and Producer, and one of your passions is the Theatre, Having appeared in many productions both in the UK including Manchester, and the USA, however, you once mentioned to me in the past, that playing Joyce Gresham in 'Shadowlands' based on C.S. Lewis was a favourite role of yours?

I believe as an actress or actor one is fortunate in a career to have even a handful of roles that satisfy all elements of production and casting, where the cast gels and are simpatico and the production design lifts the material to what I would call special. Jo Read did that at Salisbury Playhouse with SHADOWLANDS. Audience members came back multiple times to see that production often coming up to me after the performance with tears streaming down their faces. I've experienced that at the Royal Exchange, during MISFITS as well.

Is it true that the late Alan Rickman who would later play the Sheriff in 'Robin Hood Prince of Thieves' encouraged you to audition at RADA to become an actress?

Yes, we met at a cocktail party given by his Latymer Upper School English teacher. We hit it off immediately. I still have letters from him telling me how special my performance is in YANKS and not to have plastic surgery! He also came to me before he made DIE HARD to ask me about film acting and then many years later when I was staying with him he asked me if I thought he should play Snape. Of course, I said yes. At that time he hadn't read any of the books and I was hooked. He came to every play of mine he could whether on Broadway or at the Royal Exchange! I would also add that Alan and I had the pleasure of working together on JUDAS KISS.

And finally Lisa, many people would like to know did Matt ever return to Jean as promised at the end of the movie 'Yanks' ?



(His status was later nearly elevated to sainthood when he lent his own Personal Address System to a band who turned up without theirs, thus saving the day).

Saturday ended with the Big Wolf Band and Zoe Green blasting out a fusion of blues and rock to an appreciative band club audience.

The Two Hats Blues Band started Sunday off with a pleasant mix of blues roots music, a hint of ragtime jazz and three part harmonies. Nick Bold and the Raging Sea gave us a mix of rock and blues, and original songs and covers, at a packed Diggle Band Club.

The festival ended on a high with the unbelievably talented Paul Rose Band at a full Kilngreen Hall. With the tenth festival over successfully, work can start on the next one in January.

our own little jolly.


"We had such a nice time, it was really funny because we



Optician director's spec-tacular recovery merits special adversity award

The owners of a successful West Yorkshire opticians overcame adversity to grow their company, despite one of the co-founders contracting a life-threatening illness just months after opening their doors.

Greenfield and Meltham-based Allegro Optical, which provides a unique optical services to musicians and performers worldwide as well as local eye-care, picked up the Chairman's Special Award at last night's (23 May) FSB Celebrating Small Business Awards at Battersea Evolution in London. The award was given to a business that has faced and overcome major difficulties.

Allegro Optical Managing Director Stephen Tighe, who co-founded the business with partner Sheryl Doe, fell seriously ill in 2017 just months after opening the practice in Meltham and was hospitalised for almost three months.

Despite musician Stephen's life support machine being switched off, he beat the odds and recovered - and amazingly has now returned to work full-time.

Stephen's illness meant Sheryl, managing director and dispensing optician, had to run and grow the business on her own, and managed to keep the opticians open six days per week, despite daily hospital visits.

The business works with The Royal Northern College of Music, The Halle

Orchestra and Huddersfield Philharmonic to help musicians who struggle to focus on printed music and written notation due to a variety of eye conditions. Known as the 'musician's optician', they are the first and only opticians to become registered British Association of Performing Arts Medicine practitioners.

Allegro Optical, which employs 14 people, now works with musicians from major international ensembles including English National Ballet Philharmonic and Dublin RTE Concert Orchestra.

FSB National Chairman Mike Cherry said: "This is an incredible story of a family business defeating the odds, not only managing to continue and grow their company, but overcoming adversity in terms of Stephen's health too. The whole team, led by Sheryl and Stephen have pulled together to make sure Allegro Optical is a success, and it's down to them that the businesses has gone from strength to strength.

"The opticians not only provides an important community service, but has carved out a niche, providing eye-care to renouned mucisicans. It gives me

huge pleasure to present Allegro Optical with this award."

Co-founders Sheryl Doe and Stephen Tighe, said: "We are so pleased to have won this award. It's been a tough couple of years since we opened our first bricks and mortar store in 2017, but the family worked together and the business continued to grow.

"We're really proud of how the business has grown so far and with 69

There are three main forms, distinguished largely by the extent of the loss: alopecia areata [AA], referring to the partial loss of hair from the head, usually patchy rather than general thinning; alopecia totalis [AT], which is the loss of all head hair; and alopecia universalis [AU], the loss of all head and body hair.

The immune system which normally protects the body from foreign invaders, such as viruses and bacteria, mistakenly attacks the hair follicles, which is what leads to hair loss. The hair follicles are not destroyed, therefore the hair does have the possibility to re-grow and many people with Alopecia Areata do experience full regrowth. However once the condition has developed to Alopecia Totalis or Alopecia Universalis, the chances of full regrowth become smaller. It is also quite common for people with Alopecia Areata to experience hair loss on and off throughout their life.

Alopecia Areata typically starts as one or more small, smooth bald patches on the scalp. The hair loss can remain as patchy hair loss or can continue until all hair on the scalp is lost or complete loss of hair from the body.

Treatments may be offered by a Dermatologist but unfortunately none are guaranteed to work.

Alopecia is very unpredictable and therefore everyone's experience is very different.

they require funds.



US-CHINA TRADE WARS - WHAT'S THE REAL STORY?

The very public arguments between the US and China over trade have serious implications for the global economy. The two biggest economies going head to head has the potential to cause a recession amongst other things. However, it is the fact that they are the two biggest economies that is really the whole point of the argument, especially given that China is likely to overtake the US at some point over the next 15-20

The US has enjoyed its status as the major global economic superpower since the end of World War II, especially following the demise of the Soviet Union. However, the growth seen in China over the last 20 years has been nothing short of miraculous and with a population more than fourtimes the size of America's, eventually China will surpass them and become the major economic power.

One Belt, One Road

China has two major initiatives that it hopes will enable it to reach the number one position. The first of these, One Belt, One Road, concerns

infrastructure and influence. China has invested heavily in neighbouring countries, and some a bit further afield, to improve transport links. This enables them to trade more easily with these countries but also provides a useful foothold into a country and a chance to influence it. In fact, several of these countries are now in debt to China who lent them the money to carry out some of the infrastructure spending.

The Chinese government calls the initiative "a bid to enhance regional connectivity and embrace a brighter future". Some observers see it as a push for Chinese dominance in global affairs with a China-centered trading network. The project has a targeted completion date of 2049 which coincides with the 100th anniversary of the People's Republic of China.

Made in China 2025

The second initiative is the one that has angered the US the most. Made in China 2025 is China's attempt to dominate the global market in new technology industries, including robotics, new energy vehicles and artificial intelligence. This poses a clear competitive threat to the US and goes a long way in explaining the stance taken by the US in relation to Huawei.

China is looking at moving away from just being the world's producer of cheap, low quality goods and move into higher value products and services. This also ties in with its desire to maintain economic growth, standards of living and meet the demands of its increasingly educated

The US regard it as a real existential threat to US technological leadership and they are not wrong. China is now number one for research and patents in Artificial Intelligence (AI) and number two, behind the US, for the number of AI companies. It dominates the consumer drone market, accounting for 74% market share, and 5G is proving to be the next big

battleground – hence the focus on Huawei.

A famous ancient Chinese writer, Sun Tzu, wrote in "The Art of War" that "Ultimate excellence lies not in winning every battle, but in defeating the enemy without ever fighting". The use of economic power to advance political objectives is a perfect illustration of this.

So what does this mean for the ongoing trade dispute? Ultimately there are no winners in a trade war and with a US Presidential election coming up in 2020 Trump will be keen to bring this phase of discussions to some sort of conclusion sooner rather than later. Especially if he can do so by claiming a "win". On the other side, China have no such election issues but the need to continue to satisfy their ever growing middle class leads also to a need to resolve this dispute so they can concentrate on keeping the general population happy.

The rhetoric has been less diplomatic of late, which is why Stock Markets fell back in May, but should there be any evidence of an agreement being reached then expect to see a rebound. However, over the longer term this argument is not over, in fact it may have only just begun.

Pensions and divorce

As well as being some of the most valuable assets a couple can own, pensions are among the least well understood and can easily be overlooked when reaching a divorce settlement without proper advice. Gianna Lisiecki-Cunane, Saddleworth resident and partner at JMW Solicitors LLP examines the issues.

The problem

I remember last year reading research undertaken by Prudential which showed that survey respondents who were approaching retirement had lower expected incomes if they had experienced marriage breakdown. Analysis like this only tells part of the story but I do know that it is essential for couples going through a divorce to think seriously about pensions early on. All too often, people neglect pensions, to their cost.

What you can do

The first step is to get to know your own situation as many do not. As you move through your working life, you can build up multiple pension pots which can be over looked due to changes of home address or restructuring in the financial services industry. Make a timeline of all your jobs and think about what pensions were included. Dig out your old paperwork and use www. findpensioncontacts.service.gov.uk to see who administers your pensions today.

When your spouse is asked to provide you with financial disclosure, you should get a chance to ask questions, including whether you think there are any gaps in their pension history. That said, avoid the temptation to look for their private papers around the home because it is unlawful to search through your spouse's personal documents without permission.

What we can do

A good solicitor will help you work out what you really want from your financial settlement in terms of pensions. Pensions can be split between a divorcing couple using pension sharing orders, even if one party has no provision beyond the state pension. In other cases, one party can take a greater share of non-pension assets to compensate them, sometimes known as offsetting. There is also the option of a pension attachment order, which is the right solution in a particular minority of cases.

Financial advice

I work closely with financial advisers, planners and actuaries so that my clients know that all possible avenues have been explored properly. The rules on pension drawdown changed significantly in 2015, providing a huge variety of new options for those approaching retirement age. This can be complicated and getting it wrong can land you with a huge — avoidable — tax bill.

Pensions are not just for people who are or about to be retired. Couples divorcing in their twenties and thirties need to consider the issue seriously. Divorce costs money simply because you need more resources to run two households than one. However, there are ways of dealing with pensions to ensure that your divorce settlement gives you security into the future.

SUMMER BOOK REVIEWS

Young or old we all like a good read, whether lounging by the pool on holiday or just before bedtime. James & Louise Ashmore who own Read bookshop in the heart of Holmfirth have two crackers for you to try this summer...

SALTWATER by Jessica Andrews Review by James Ashmore



This astonishing debut novel from Jessica Andrews breaks new ground at the turn of every page. Its multiple time-strand narrative cleverly jigsaws the story into numbered sections that a reader needs to piece together to construct the final image. And, boy, is the reader rewarded for their efforts.

Lucy, born and raised in Sunderland to a working-class family, wins a place at university in London, a world away from her roots. After initially embracing a lifestyle she'd imagined from afar, things begin to fall apart and Lucy's time in London, stretched by the need to work long hours and her own expectations for student living, unravels. She retreats to her grandfather's cottage in Ireland to seek out an identity she expected to construct in the city, but instead finds in the wilds of the countryside.

Andrews's skill here is to drip-feed this narrative to us through her beautiful prose, prose suffused with the poetry she also writes. Listen to this, as Lucy addresses the unnamed boyfriend she begins to see in Ireland: "There is a smell in your skin that scares me. Sweet. Sour. A smell that thrills me and makes me sick. I note the gentle ooze of your hips over your jeans, the molten, gorgeous spill of you. The world is full of eyes on fire in ways I could not see until now." This is a passionate voice from an author unafraid to play with language, to experiment with rhythm. You could turn to any page in the book and discover something special.

Indeed, you could also turn to any page and see her fast-paced reminiscences, her acutely observed monologues from the point of view of a teenage Lucy as she and her friends, bubbling with all the potential of kids that age, record all they see. The cultural references that pepper their discussions (MSN Messenger, Oasis, MySpace, The Arctic Monkeys...) are chronological signposts for the reader as much as they are descriptive detail, guiding you through Andrew's astounding novel.

For a debut novel, this is as accomplished as it gets. Andrews has taken the mould and smashed it. She deserves real success with this book; I urge you to read it.

PAPER PLANES by Jim Helmore and Richard Jones

There have been some beautiful children's picture books released this



year which explore our emotions, from dealing with loss, self-belief and being brave. However, the book "Paper Planes" has really caught our eye.

Paper Planes is about two children, Ben and Mia, who are inseparable. They do everything together and have a wonderful friendship. They spend their days making paper planes and seeing how far they will fly. Their dream is to make a paper plane that will fly over their lake.

Unfortunately, Ben's parents make the decision to move away and the children are devastated; they can't imagine their lives without each other. They are one and the same.

As time passes, both children are sad. They feel incomplete and miss each other terribly. They each make their own paper plane to fly towards each other. Their love and friendship are stronger than the distance between them and the two are reunited.

Books can be a great prompt for discussing sensitive topics with young children and this is a perfect starting




WELLIFEST 2019



For the beans:

I teaspoon of English mustard 2 tablespoons of rapeseed oil I red onion diced

2 cloves of garlic crushed 2 tablespoons of smoked paprika ½ teaspoon of ground cinnamon

3 cloves

1/2 teaspoon of dried chilli flakes I tablespoon of dark brown sugar I 20g of cooked smoked ham hock 450g of passata

2 tins of white beans

For the pork belly:

400g cooked pork belly
2 tablespoons of smoked paprika
4 tablespoons of plain flour
Maple syrup

To serve:

elebrating

4 slices for seeded brown bread Chives and parsley chopped

Method Beans:

• Pre heat your oven to 165 degrees

- In a heavy based casserole dish over a medium heat add oil, onion, garlic, paprika, mustard, cinnamon, cloves and chilli, sauté for 3-5 minutes without adding colour
- Stir in the sugar and remove from the heat
- Add ham hock, beans and passata and lightly mix together. Cover the dish with a lid and place in the middle of the preheated oven and bake for 40 minutes
- Once cooked remove from the oven and stir lightly taking care not to smash the beans
- Stand for 10 minutes

Pork belly:

Whilst your beans are standing prepare the pork belly

- Slice the cooked pork belly
- Mix the paprika and flour and coat the sliced pork belly, shallow fry until golden brown on both sides
- Remove from the pan and coat in maple syrup depending on taste, for the sweet tooth just add more syrup

To Serve

 Toast the bread and then cover with the beans and top with the maple glazed pork belly and finish with a sprinkling of parsley and chives

celizaleth Raffald - The mother of the modern wedding cake



wonderful stories about people and the things they have done. Some stories are well known, some are private and some, sadly are lost in the past. Unfortunately the story of Elizabeth Raffald is one that is largely forgotten, even in Manchester where she acheived so much?

where she acheived so much."

A former housekeeper at Arley Hall in Cheshire, Elizabeth moved to Manchester in 1763 when she married the head gardener and was bound by the rules of at The Hall that married servants had to leave. Six years later the recipes she had devised there, were written down and advertised for sale as 'The Experienced English Housekeeper.

Amongst the many innovative recipes in the book was her recipe for Bride Cake, the blueprint of the modern wedding cake - a rich fruit cake decorated with two types of icing, almond icing (marzipan) and what later, when used to decorate Queen Victoria's wedding cake became known as royal icing.

royal icing.

'One of my missions as a modern cake designer is to make sure the traditional skills of sugarcraft continue to be used, practised, developed and passed on, so when I heard about Elizabeth, her work in Manchester and her historic wedding cake recipe I had to find out more. I found it fascinating that the wedding cake as we know it began with this book, written by this figure of whom I had never heard but who, as I discovered had an incredible story, for as well as being a cook and a mother, she was hugely enterprising. She set up a confectioner's shop, established an employment register for domestic servants, opened a cookery school to teach her

recipes and catered for dinner parties. She produced the first Manchester trade directory in 1772, invested in two newspapers and collaborated on a book of midwifery. Her contribution to the development of Manchester in the 18th Century can't be overstated and it is such a shame that there is little in the city to commemorate her and her astounding body of work.

body of work.

Cape Coral Mourvedre Rose. Waterkloof, South Africa 2017

A stunning South African rival to the aristocratic Provence roses, this is a little Stellenbosch

NOW IS THE TIME!

Transform your body this summer and feel healthier

Transform your body this summer, cut back on your calories and get active – simple. Everybody feels so much better when they feel good about their body. Also, a lot of people make excuses about how they can't lose the weight, generally if you eat less and move more you will lose weight, so it's not rocket science. You don't have to be the leanest person on the planet, just try and be healthy.

Start exercising and eating healthy and if you feel like your body fat percentage is too high, then exercise more and cut back on your daily calorie intake. To be in a calorie deficit is when the number of calories you consume is less than the number of calories required for bodyweight maintenance.

The first picture of me was week 1.1 virtually did the same amount and level of intensity of training, however 1 just ate way too many calories. My food was pretty good overall but my problem was portion control. I was eating way too many calories and that lead to me putting on excess body fat. The leaner picture of me was after 8 weeks of cutting back on my calories, kept my training the same and the body fat slowly dropped off me. I

dropped from 103kg on the first pic to 100kg. I tried to maintain my muscle mass and reduce the body fat leading to an overall leaner appearance.

At first it was hard as I love my food. I was so used to eating a lot of calories but once I started tracking my calories on My Fitness pal app the body fat just dropped off. This is the most sustainable way to do it as I could eat what I wanted when I wanted just as long as I kept within my calorie deficit. On the Week I picture I wasn't even counting my calories and I was probably having over 3000 calories a day easily. The second picture I was never over 2200 calories a day which with my daily activity lead to reduced body fat percentage.

If have changed my body shape in 8 weeks, so can you!

Let's start now!


First step – keep a food diary or My Fitness pal app, this keeps you accountable for what you are putting into your body (be honest with it). Track your calories for the first week, eating what you normally have. If you feel like your over weight then maybe cut your calories per day in the second week by 200. Everybody's calories needed per day are different

because there are so many variables e.g. weight, age, height, levels of physical activity, genetics but tracking what you eat will give you a rough guide on where you are at. If you are not losing weight then cut back a little more on your calorie intake, if you are

feeling hungry and lacking energy then up your calorie intake a little to fuel your body. Make sure 95 percent of the calories you are putting in your body are nutritious and not empty calories containing no nutrients. This will help fuel your body and workouts so you will train better. If you eat well, then it will give you more energy when training and you can push yourself more.

Second step – Plan your food/meals for the week so you know what you're going to eat don't stock up on too much unhealthy food. If it's not in the house, then there's less chance of eating rubbish. Have a healthy food shop!

Third step – Plan in your diary when your available to do exercise. A lot of people have busy lives so it's

important to stick to your available times to train, run, swim, etc.

Fourth step – Keep to your calories on weekends as there's no point having 1500 calories a day then on a weekend have 3000. If you are craving a reward for yourself, that's fine but keep within the calories for that day.

Enjoy your summer and don't spend all of it in the beer garden. If you fancy a beer or a glass of wine, then have it but keep to your own calorie control or better still have a gin and tonic to save the on the calories. Be patient with it and keep the consistency with your nutrition and it will lead to a happier, healthier, leaner body ready for summer.

OFF THE HOOK:

Exclusive Peter Hook Interview

Around Saddleworth & Tameside speaks to a Manchester music legend ready to light up this year's Cotton Clouds festival this August.

One might have thought that years of interviews would have left Peter Hook tired of the process. One might have assumed the same after almost 45 years of touring and playing live shows. This couldn't be further from the truth.

On the phone, Hook's tone is jovial and chatty, instantly reminiscing about his Joy Division days, and some of his early memories of Saddleworth:

"I actually know Saddleworth really well because we used to go to raves in 1986/87/88. A girl I knew had access to a big PA system and we used to go to Saddleworth so we wouldn't be disturbed. So, if anyone was kept up in that era by some drugged up lunatics in the middle of the night, then I apologise as I may have been involved."

As well as these early days, Hook did have some more... wholesome memories of Saddleworth:

"I lived in Moston for 10 years, so we even used to and take the kids up there a lot as well but it will be nice to come back and play it."

Upon forming Peter Hook and the Light, Hook's own son, Jack Bates, was instituted as bass player, however, Jack has now moved on to another globally recognised rock piece:

"I lost a lot of, so called, friends from the New Order days, but Billy Corgan of the Smashing Pumpkins was a great friend of mine who stuck by me. So, whenever we played near where he lived he would come and sing with us which is obviously fantastic. The only problem is that when he'd seen my son play a few times he decided to poach him! Just goes to show you can't trust anybody, especially not rock stars!"

Peter Hook was one of the many artists that was supposedly inspired by the famous Sex Pistols gig at the Manchester Lesser Free Trade Hall, having gone out an bought his bass guitar following the performance.

He and Bernard Sumner then went and formed Joy Division in 1976. The years have not lessened Hook's love of performing live though:

"It's always great to play loads of gigs and festivals. One of the big things about New Order is that we didn't play a lot of gigs and they still don't. I always hated not playing live so one of the silver linings of New Order splitting up is that I can play whenever and wherever I want because we just love gigging."

At the time of the interview, Peter Hook and the Light were getting ready to play the Isle of Wight festival, something that Hook himself was especially excited about, however, it's the north of England that still holds the Mancunian's heart:

"It's always nice to play up north though I have a real affinity with certain places up north that we used to gig in the early days of New Order but we got out of the habit once we became big so it's always nice to go back to your roots if you like.

Northern audiences are always such a pleasure."

Hook's love for the north also comes because of the amount of great music it has created over the years and urges more local youngsters to get out and make music:

"I can't think of anything better than being in a Northern group. You can take it anywhere because the whole world is waiting for that music. There aren't many places like the North of England that has made so many globally famous bands and we're very lucky to have that. If that doesn't inspire young musicians I don't know what will!"

Hook also points to today's political climate as a reason to go out and make music:

"Politically we're due a revolution, Boris bloody Johnson... can we not. I really feel for you young kids cos you're having your future taken away so I hope you find a solution I really do. But that's just another reason that we need festivals, it sends politics out of the window. It's just a great step away from reality where people can come to listen to music and have a good time."

So, what can Cotton Clouds goers expect from Peter Hook and Light's Friday night headline spot?

"We're very passionate and very energetic on stage even at my age because we love what we do and we love to get crowds excited. In terms of songs, we'll sit together and get a setlist together made up of songs from both bands. It will mostly be made up of hits for a festival because no one turns up to festivals for a bunch of

dodgy b-sides."
